
Understanding Question

Think of instances in the Bible where seemingly impossible feats were done by the people of God.






Understanding Question

#2

In v. 24, it says, "whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." How come there are prayers that are not answered even if we fully believe? (cross ref.: Mark 14: 36).

Why do we need to forgive others when we stand in prayer? (v. 25)

How can having an unforgiving heart hinder our prayers? (cross ref. Matt. 18:21–35 Read the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant).




