




The Ark Brought to Jerusalem

1 David again brought together all the able young men of Israel-thirty thousand. 2 He and all his men went to Baalah in Judah to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the Name, the name of the Lord Almighty, who is enthroned between the cherubim on the ark.

3 They set the ark of God on a new cart and brought it from the house of Abinadab, which was on the hill. Uzzah and Ahio, sons of Abinadab, were guiding the new cart 4 with the ark of God on it, and Ahio was walking in front of it.





5 David and all Israel were celebrating with all their might before the Lord, with castanets, harps, lyres, timbrels, sistrums and cymbals.


6 When they came to the threshing floor of Nakon, Uzzah reached out and took hold of the ark of God, because the oxen stumbled. 7 The Lord's anger burned against Uzzah because of his irreverent act; therefore God struck him down, and he died there beside the ark of God.

8 Then David was angry because the Lord's wrath had broken out against Uzzah, and to this day that place is called Perez Uzzah.

9 David was afraid of the Lord that day and said, "How can the ark of the Lord ever come to me?"

10 He was not willing to take the ark of the Lord to be with him in the City of David. Instead, he took it to the house of Obed-Edom the Gittite. 11 The ark of the Lord remained in the house of Obed-Edom the Gittite for three months, and the Lord blessed him and his entire household.

Who transported the Ark of God, and how did they do it? (v. 2-4)




As the Ark of God was being transported, what happened, and what was the consequence? (v.6-7)



How did David react to what happened? What did he do after what unfolded? V. 8-10




Uzzah was trying to protect the ark of God from falling to the ground. Do you think God was overly harsh to Uzzah? Why or why not?

In v. 8-9, why do you think David's initial reaction was anger then turned into fear? What do David's actions teach us about seeking to do God's will?

Despite having experienced God's protection and provision over the years, David failed at that time to follow instructions and understand the gravity of God's holiness in his eagerness to bring over the Ark of God. Uzzah, meanwhile, treated as commonplace that which is sacred and lost a sense of awe toward the things of God due to overfamiliarity (the Ark of God being in their home for years). Reflecting on your life now, how do you approach the Lord when seeking His will? Is it relaxed or reverent? Familiar or fearful? Is there a need to change the way you seek the Lord in your life now? Why or why not?



Are there things in your life right now that are preventing you from consistently remembering God's holiness and being attuned to His will? What steps do you need to take to walk in obedience to God and just like Obed-edom in v. 11 welcome the presence of the living God in your life?
