God, Make me Hungry for You!

Read Psalm 63:1-11

We are wired to yearn for satisfaction or fulfillment. The big question is, where and to whom do we direct our yearning for wholeness?

If we are not hungry for His presence (sheer enjoyment) and His purposes (participation in His work), then, we consequently end up hungering for something else.

We chase after things that are naturally attractive to us in response to these kinds of hunger:

- · Financial security
- \cdot Career success
- · Praise and affirmation of others
- Boy-girl relationships
- · Marriage, and more.

But only Jesus can genuinely give life with deep and abiding satisfaction. He calls this life Eternal life or abundant life. "He is more than enough for me" goes the chorus. The hungrier we are for God, the more alive we are.

As someone said - the most powerful prayer any Christian can pray is, "God, make me hungry for You."

We are all a product of our spiritual appetite and none of us is greater than our prayer life. We get what we thirst for.

There are two kinds of spiritual hunger or restlessness of which I am keenly aware.

1. Hunger for His presence, Psalm 63:1, the reward of which is satisfaction & pleasure, Psalm 16:11



2. Hunger for His purpose, Acts 20:24, that is, hungry to participate in His global mission

As someone well put it -

"There is a healthy restlessness that each of us should embrace – the restlessness that longs for heaven, for a deeper knowledge of God's presence; the restlessness that marks us out as nothing more than pilgrims, passing through this temporary place and heading for our true destination.

Wise men still travel."


The EiP Choir also recorded a song, Press On, to remind us to keep on toward the prize in spite of difficulties. Yna Reyes emceed the service.

He has a passion to see people's lives changed through the preaching of the gospel.

How the EHS Books and Course Helped Me

I had the privilege to take the Emotionally Healthy Spirituality online course from May 8 – July 3, 2021. Going through the course itself and through the work of the Holy Spirit, it was an experience of a beneath-the-surface look into one's inner self, of who I am and what I had experienced in the past that made me who I am, and allowing God to speak and transform me for a deeper relationship with Him and with others and of having an emotionally healthy spirituality.

The book was a good read for learning and re-learning, discovering and re-discovering realities in my own life as a person and as a Christian as we went through the sessions for 8 weeks. The videos by author Peter Scazzero added to the gleanings and learnings I read in each chapter of the book.

The Manual helped me process and answer questions on some issues and experiences I went through in my life. For instance, Chapter 4 - Journey Through the Wall – was a lesson on letting go of power and control. The "walls' the Lord has allowed me to go through were indeed His way of purging or re-wiring me for a deeper, closer relationship with Him. Chapter 5 which is Enlarging Our Soul Through Grief and Loss allowed me to have a deeper introspection that through the griefs and painful experiences my family had gone through in the past, God had used them in enlarging my soul, of getting closer to God and being stronger in my faith. In Chapter 6 which is about Discovering the Rhythms of the Daily Office and Sabbath, it has helped me form the habit of taking a moment of my day to center my awareness on God through the disciplines of silent meditation and prayer. Though I already practiced Sabbath days, the chapter has helped me savor more the value in the gift of Sabbath in my





life – not only in my weekly schedule but even inserting mini-Sabbaths in my mostly occupied daily schedule.

The last chapter on the Rule of Life is something similar to the Individual Growth Plan which we in our mission organization are encouraged to do yearly focusing on three major missionary growth areas: Spiritual Formation, Self-Management Skills and Ministry Skills. In this last chapter of the EHS Course, there was emphasis in cultivating habits and disciplines in the areas of Prayer, Rest, Relationship and Work. This chapter has encouraged me even more to do these disciplines with consistency whether in my daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly or yearly goals - not by being mechanical but using them creatively as guide and life goals in the time frame God allows me to accomplish them to be a better person for His good purposes and glory.

Lastly, the companion booklet Day by Day - 40-Day Journey with the Daily Office, has helped me establish my daily routine of

KBCF Building Project:

A Journey of Faith

It all began in 2008 when one KBCF member donated P500,000 as seed money to renovate the then 33-year-old church edifice. It has been over 12 years and we are still waiting to witness God's surprise for us and set foot on our new church building – which we believe will be very soon!

The Lord provided us with a parcel of land on May 14, 1979, along 11th Jamboree Street, and the construction of our church building immediately commenced the following year. After 5 years of gradual development, the two-level building was formally dedicated to God during KBCF's 10th year anniversary on Dec. 14, 1985.




Since the official launch of our "Building Project" in March 2009, it had undergone four major design revisions with the loving dedication of two architects – Arch. Ed Madulid and Arch. Jun Espinosa.



After the long and arduous process of technical design amendments, acquiring government requirements and permits, we finally got our Building Permit from the Quezon City Department of Building Official Services in August 2019. With all plans set and the construction works ready to begin, the COVID-19 pandemic hit us in 2020, along with the entire world. God's timing is always perfect! It could have been a totally different story if the pandemic happened post-demolition. God has spared us from a much-complicated situation.

In the midst of the nationwide community quarantine, the Core of Leaders (COL) was able to meet and decide a very important matter – the expiration of the Building Permit. On November 14, 2020, the COL decided to call off the 4-Storey Building Construction and instead plan for the renovation and extension of the existing building structure. This also supports the earlier leadership resolution to work and plan within the available Building Fund. Moving forward, they also decided to plan and raise additional funds for the construction of a 3-level building structure adjacent to the existing.

She was quite excited when she pulled out her first lesson: commonly misused English words or phrases. Her eyes twinkled as we went through her list, and her frustration was evident over the use of "cope up" or "luggages".

Unfortunately, I did not share her passion about English then. I dreaded her class. Recitation and exercises scared me; she would immediately correct us on the spot. By the end of the program, I barely passed her standards. I might have even sworn then that I would never join any of her activities ever. Or so I thought. God had a different plan. Three years later, I found myself involved in the Scroll ministry, where Tita Vicki served as one of the editors. I knew the quality of work she expected and my writing was far from it. However, she was very patient. Every time she finished editing my work, she would point out areas for improvement. Sometimes, she would walk me through my piece so we could work on it together. Her constant encouragement pushed me out of my comfort zone and helped me find confidence in myself.

When I turned 17, our *working* relationship blossomed into an "unlikely" friendship. Neither of us expected that we would become friends despite our 47-year age gap. We bonded over our love for Nancy Drew, Philippine history, watercolor paintings, and the

color green. As years went by, we became even closer. She shared stories about her family - from her younger years to present anecdotes of her grandchildren.

Tita Vicki never failed to ask how I was doing. She was a cheerleader and prayer partner. When she learned I volunteered to teach English to the youth in the church my Dad pastored, she instantly sent me materials.

While there are many other memories for which I thank the Lord, I am most grateful for Tita Vicki's legacy. Her love, excellence, and passion shaped who I am today. Thank you, Tita Vicki for your love and friendship. Thank You Jesus for sharing Tita Vicki with us. We know that death has no power and we will see Tita Vicki again soon.
